Maths:

- ◆ We will be learning to estimate an answer to a question and use the inverse operation to check the answer.
- ◆ To add and subtract numbers mentally including:
- ◆ A 3 digit number and ones/ tens/ hundreds
- ◆ To be able to use written methods including column addition/subtraction
- ◆ Solve problems including: number problems, using number facts, place value and more complex addition and subtraction

English:

- ◆ To engage children with a story with which they will empathise.
- ◆ To explore themes and issues, and develop and sustain ideas through discussion, enabling children to make connections with their own lives.
- ◆ To develop creative responses to the text through responding to reading, drama and artwork.
- ◆ To develop reader response and comprehension through wide range of cross-curricular opportunities.

History:

- ◆ Ask historically valid questions about change, cause, similarity, difference and significance.
- ◆ Research how a significant person changed History and make modern comparisons

Music:

- ◆ Listen with attention to detail and recall sounds
- ◆ Develop an understanding of the history of music
- ◆ Understand and appreciate a wide range of live and recorded music from different cultures.
